Every culture has a **tradition** or **custom** that helps people feel connected to the past. These traditions may include food, clothing, stories or music.

During a **national holiday**, families might prepare **traditional food** and have a **family gathering**. These moments can create strong memories.

Celebrations also support **cultural identity** because they remind people where they come from. They can build **community spirit** when neighbours celebrate together.

Traditions can change over time, but many people still want to respect them. Passing them down helps younger generations understand their history and values.
