2. Grammar in context

Read the text. The bold phrases show the grammar used in a natural topic context.

Learning From a Safety Mistake

A student nearly had an accident while cycling to school. If he **had checked** the traffic more carefully, he **would have noticed** the car earlier.

Luckily, nobody was hurt. However, the situation **could have been** much worse if the driver **had not stopped** quickly.

Afterwards, the school reminded students about road safety. If that cyclist **had used** bike lights and reflective clothing, drivers **would have seen** them more easily.

3. Notice the pattern

Use the third conditional to imagine a different result in the past.

Use	Form / signal	Example
If clause	if + past perfect	If he had checked the traffic,
Result	would have + past participle	he would have noticed the car.
Possibility	could/might have + past participle	It could have been worse.
Negative	if + had not + past participle	If the driver had not stopped, nobody would have been safe.

Notes for checking

1. If clause: if + past perfect - If he had checked the traffic,
2. Result: would have + past participle - he would have noticed the car.
3. Possibility: could/might have + past participle - It could have been worse.
4. Negative: if + had not + past participle - If the driver had not stopped, nobody would have been safe.
